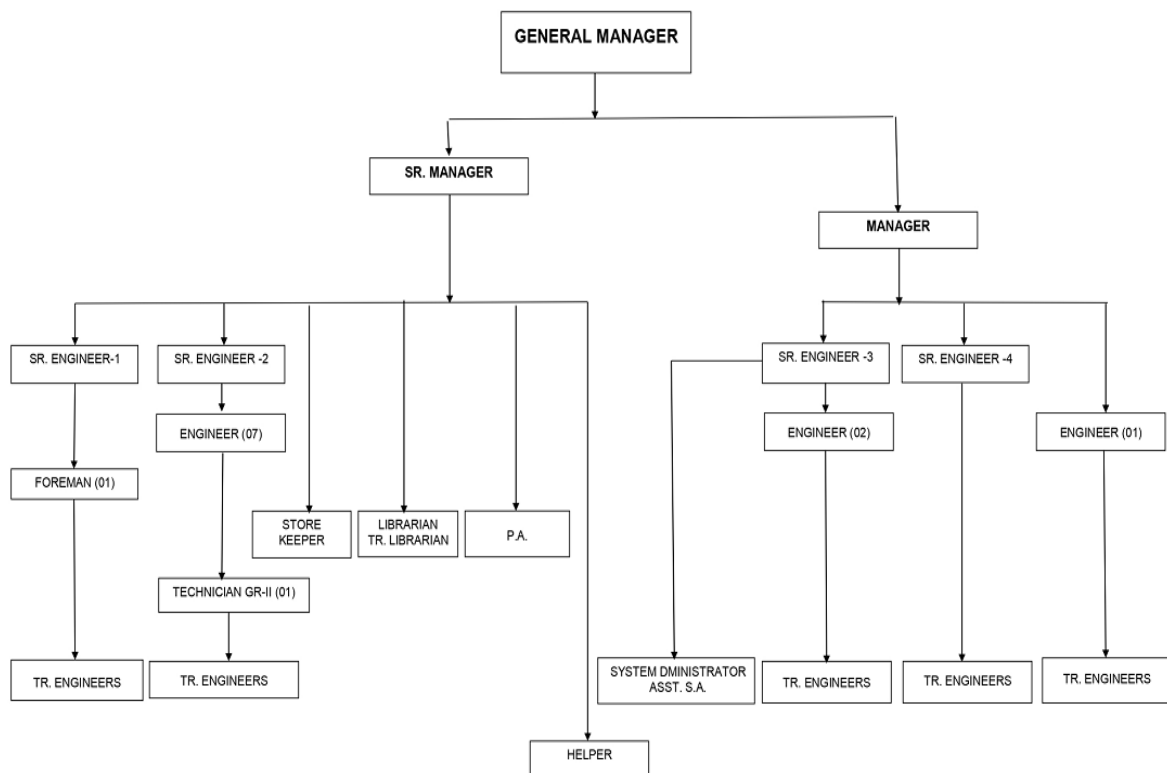

- **Nature and Extent of involvement of Faculty and students in academic affairs/improvements**

Initiatives taken to inculcate the spirit of research amongst faculty and students are as follows:  
Following research policy was framed.

- Financial assistance is provided for publications
- Facilities such as flexibility in timings, use of laboratories etc. are extended to faculty as per requirement
- Implementing a policy for distribution of Testing and Consultancy charges to motivate faculty for providing consultancy
- Generating awareness amongst the researchers and providing support related to various proposal formats of different funding agencies, budget, purchases of equipment and material under research schemes, account and audit of project expenditure, any additional infrastructure requirements of the researcher etc.
- Increasing faculty and student publications by providing financial assistance
- Collaborative research partnerships with academic institutes and industry are encouraged and fostered. Collaborating/partnering with research institutes / different industries, for student projects
- Assistance is provided for filing patents
- An Industry Institute Interaction Cell works in close coordination with the industries and the institute for encouraging both students and faculty to work on live projects. (Obtain industry sponsored projects)
- An initiative is taken by Library to help researchers in understanding recent updates of their publications
- In-house development of both lab equipment and software
- **Human resource management**

IGTR management believes that faculty and staff are the backbone of the institute and that its success depends on the quality of human resources. Therefore, the objectives of human resource management are focused on maximizing employee performance. Priority is given for recruitment of suitable, competent faculty, training them to meet their teaching objectives, helping them realize their potential, rewarding high performing faculty and counseling low performing faculty based on their performance appraisal.

In addition,

- Training is arranged for teaching as well as nonteaching staff by identifying training needs, for enhancing professional competencies, teaching and soft skills
- Service rules are transparent and benefits like Provident Fund, Gratuity, Group Insurance Scheme, Medclaim etc. are provided to employees
- The institute arranges financial planning lectures for staff, to assist them for effective planning of their finances
- The institute arranges lectures for staff, to assist them for effective stress management and health

- Institute implements a variety of welfare schemes for teaching and non-teaching staff like Medclaim Policy, Group Insurance, Provident Fund, Credit Cooperative Society, Gratuity, Fee concession to children of faculty and studying at Vishwakarma Institutes

- **Industry interaction**

As part of the quality improvement strategy and to bridge the gap between academics and industry, the institute has established an Industry-Institute Interaction cell (I2IC) and IAB. Regular interaction with the industries is established through meetings, guest lectures, internships, projects and industrial visits.

**In order to enhance industry interaction, the following strategies are implemented:**

- Departments to appoint industry coordinator who will interact with the industries by approaching local industries: to understand their expectations in terms of knowledge and skill requirements in a graduating engineer
- To identify and invite industry experts to deliver content beyond syllabus and make students aware of contemporary issues and engineering practices adopted in the industry
- To provide industry exposure to students through internships in industry, industry visits and enable them to pick up skills besides what is being imparted in the classrooms
- Obtain industry sponsored final year projects

- **Mechanism/ Norms and Procedure for democratic/ good Governance**

The management recognizes the need for decentralization for the growth of the institute and accords autonomy commensurate with the level of management. I/c Academics and heads are appointed who are given autonomy for efficient governance. The roles and responsibilities of administrators / decision makers for various assigned jobs listed below clearly depict the delegation of authority, providing operational autonomy leading to a decentralized governance system.

- **Principal**

To implement and monitor the education system to cater to the institute's vision and mission.

- **I/c Academics**

Is responsible for academic development of the institute and monitors progress of various teaching/learning processes.

- **I/c R & D**

Monitors Research and Development activities in the institute

- **I/c Quality**

Is the Management Representative for ISO activities and is responsible for monitoring academics, day to day academic activities and assuring quality in teaching and learning process

- **I/c Administration**

Is responsible for supervision and management of all administrative and operational functions.

- **I/c Planning**

To develop a strategic plan for the growth and image of the institute.

- **Vice President Student Activities**

To initiate and monitor various student activities

- **Head of the Department**

Is responsible for the academic and administrative functions of the department. In addition, Registrar, Accounts Officer, Librarian, Workshop Superintendent take care of office related activities, finance related issues, library resources and workshop related activities. Other support

functions are handled by the Admission-in-charge, Examination Officer, Industry Institute Interaction Cell Coordinator.

**At the department level:**

- Preparation of academic calendar based on time frame set by the Institute for planning and organizing of activities is done by Time Table co-ordinator
- Each course has a course co-ordinator who, in consultation with the faculty teaching the subject, sets course objectives, prepares the teaching plan for the semester, conducts meetings with faculty regularly to monitor and review course completion and attainment of course outcomes

#### • **Grievance Redressal mechanism for Faculty, staff and students**

The Centre has a Students' Grievance Redressal Committee. The functions of the Committee are to look into the complaints lodged by any student, and judge its merit. The Grievance Redressal Committee is also empowered to look into matters of harassment.

Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the Grievance Redressal Committee members in person. In case the person is unwilling to appear in self, grievances may be sent in writing. Grievances may also be sent through e-mail to the officer in-charge of Students' Grievance Redressal Committee or Principal.

##### **Objective:-**

The objective of the Grievance Redressal Committee is to develop a responsive and accountable attitude among all the stakeholders in order to maintain a harmonious educational atmosphere in the institute.

A Grievance Redressal Committee has been constituted for the redressal of the problems reported by the Students of the College with the following objectives:

1. Upholding the dignity of the College by ensuring strife free atmosphere in the College through promoting cordial Student-Student relationship and Student teacher relationship etc.
2. Encouraging the Students to express their grievances / problems freely and frankly, without any fear of being victimized.
3. Suggestion / complaint Box have been installed in front of the Administrative Block in which the Students, who want to remain anonymous, put in writing their grievances and their suggestions for improving the Academics / Administration in the College.
4. Advising Students of the College to respect the right and dignity of one another and show utmost restraint and patience whenever any occasion of rift arises.
5. Advising All the Students to refrain from inciting Students against other Students, teachers and College administration.
6. Advising all staffs to be affectionate to the Students and not behave in a vindictive manner towards any of them for any reason.
7. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in and outside the institution. Any violation of ragging and disciplinary rules should be urgently brought to the notice of the Principal.

##### **Functions:**

The cases are attended promptly on receipt of written grievances from the students.

The Committee formally meets to review all cases, prepares a statistical report about the number of cases received, attended to and the number of pending cases, if any, which require direction and guidance from the higher authorities.

The Committee deals with Grievances received in writing from the students about any of the following matters:

- Academic Matters: Related to timely issue of duplicate Mark-sheets, Transfer Certificates, Conduct Certificates or other examination related matters.
- Financial Matters: Related to dues and payments for various items from library, hostels etc.
- Other Matters: Related to certain misgivings about conditions of sanitation, preparation of food, availability of transport etc.

##### **Procedure:**

1. The setting of the Grievance Redressal Committee for students will be widely published.
2. The students may feel free to put up a grievance in the format attached and drop it in boxes placed at conspicuous locations.
3. The GRC will act upon those cases which have been forwarded along with the necessary documents.

4. The GRC will take up only those matters which have not been solved by the different departments.
5. Grievances related to fees etc. will be taken up only if the relevant financial documents like demand drafts etc. are attached.

The Committee is requested to Contribute effectively to dispose the grievances at the earliest. A registry to register the compliant is established and kept in the Principal office under the Supervision of Administrative Officials. On receipt of the Compliant, the staff in-charge of the registry will submit the same to the Member Secretary of the "Grievance Redressal Committee". The Committee will meet, with an Information to the complainant on their day of Convenience. An aggrieved Student or Parent may appear in person to present his/her case. In the case, the complainant not satisfied with the decision of the Committee, they may send their appeals to the "OMBUDSMAN" appointed by the Affiliating University. The OMBUDSMAN will fix a date for hearing the Complainant which shall be communicated to the Institute and the aggrieved person.

The Institution shall comply with the order of the ombudsman. Any order of the OMBUDSMAN not complied with by the Institution, will be reported to AICTE for appropriate action. In case of any false/frivolous Complaint, the ombudsman may order appropriate action against Complaint.

Establishment of a Grievance Redressal Committee.

In order to comply with the AICTE Regulation for addressing, student or Parent's grievance in a Technical Institution, "Grievance Redressal Committee" of our institute has been constituted with following Staff in different positions to enquire the nature and extent of grievance. The committee can suggest the final action to be initiated at the institutional level for the redressal of the same.

The Student or Person, who are willing to launch any complaints, shall send their representation for redressal of their grievance to the following Grievances Redressal Committee.

All aggrieved parents and the stockholders may also thenceforth approach to the Grievance Redressal Committee.

A student who has been ragged or has seen someone being ragged in hostels or in departments or within the University building may submit his/her complaint to any one of the above members who may bring to the notice to the Dean, Students' Welfare immediately. Upon receipt of such complaint, the Dean, Students' Welfare shall convene a meeting of the Cell within three (3) days. Anti-Ragging Cell shall inquire into the complaint. If the complaint is found to be true and perpetrator(s) is/are identified, the Cell may make appropriate recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor as per standing Supreme Court rulings.

The Cell shall sensitize the students on anti-ragging rules from time to time and display notices in hostels and departments informing them of the likely consequences if they indulge in ragging.

#### **Activities Considered as Ragging:**

- Any conduct by words spoken or written or an act which has the effect of teasing, threading or handling with rudeness to a fresher or any other student.
- Financial extortion or act of forceful expenditure.
- Physical abuses
- Rowdy/undisciplined activities, which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical/psychological harm or fear or apprehension in any student.
- Forcing a student to do an act, which generates sense of shame, torment or embarrassment affecting his/her physique or psyche
- Any act which prevents/disturbs/disrupts regular academic activities assignment to a student
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student
- Any act affecting mental health and self-confidence of student with or without any intent to derive a sadistic pleasure showing off power, authority or superiority

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

To curb the menace of ragging in MSME Technology Centre, Bhiwadi Anti-Ragging Policy – Ragging is strictly banned in the premises of institutions. If anybody is found indulging in such activities, strict action will be taken irrespective of the extent of ragging.

To prevent ragging in the University/Colleges and also take proper action against those who are indulging in it, to root out ragging in all its forms from the institution by prohibiting it by law and preventing its occurrence by following the provisions of the Regulations of Supreme Court, to spell out suitable punishments to those found guilty.

#### **FUNCTIONS OF THE ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE**

1. To get an undertaking in the prescribed format from the candidate concerned on anti-ragging.
2. To address the students and parents by the head of the institutions on anti-ragging.
3. To arrange to send letters to parents, guardians of the students at the end of the academic year for creation of awareness.
4. To coordinate with the institutions affiliated and calling for periodical reports from them.
5. To form monitoring cells (sub-committees) consisting of mentors at the end of academic year.
6. To suggest measures to tighten the security.
7. To recommend withdrawal of affiliation of institutions which did not curb ragging effectively.
